# Thoughts on Today's Sermon Text



"On this rock I will build My church. The church will reign triumphant even at the gates of hell."

Jesus, Matthew 16:18



A Biblical Concept of the Church. It is time for us to reconsider this matter of the church. Most

people think of the church as a familiar social fact. They favor the church much the same as they support motherhood, decency and sanitation.



But I wonder how many ever sit down and say, "What is this? Maybe the church is just something that is

here; it doesn't have any value and doesn't have any reason for being here."

How many present-day
Christians have ever searched
the Scripture with a serious
burden on their hearts to
know what the church is?
It seems that the average
person spends more time
filling out income tax forms
than he or she spends in a
lifetime trying to learn from
the Scriptures and from the
light of the Spirit what the
church is and what he or she
ought to do about it.

Why is it in the world? What did Jesus mean when He said, "Upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it" (Matthew 16:18)?

First, the church is the bride of Christ. A true local church is the bride of Christ in recapitulation, in miniature. Everything that is in the whole church of Christ. should be recapitulated in the local church. The church, part of it in heaven and part of it on earth, is the bride of Christ. Our Lord Jesus washed His bride, regenerated her and prepared her. He is coming back to take her the whole church — as His bride.

A second description of the church is the body of Christ. Jesus Christ is the head,

and as the head of His church He directs it. My hands move because my head tells them to. My head directs my body. The head of a local church is not the pastor, but Jesus Christ the Lord. He is the head of the universal church of which the local church is a part. A local church is not all the body of Christ, but in miniature it is the body of Christ.

This brings to light a most wonderful truth. In the body of Christ there are no insignificant congregations. Each has His Name and each

is honored by His Presence. Large or small, the church must be an assembly of believers brought together through a Name to worship a Presence. The blessed thing is that God does not ask whether it is a big church or a little church.

But people do insist on asking questions about size and number of people because they are carnal. I know all about such human judgments. "This is a very little church," or, "That is a poor, unknown church." Meanwhile, God is saying, "It is My church — they are all My churches, and each has every right to all I bestow!"

- <sup>20</sup> And He gave the disciples orders to tell no one that He was the Messiah.




