The Trap: Human Resolve

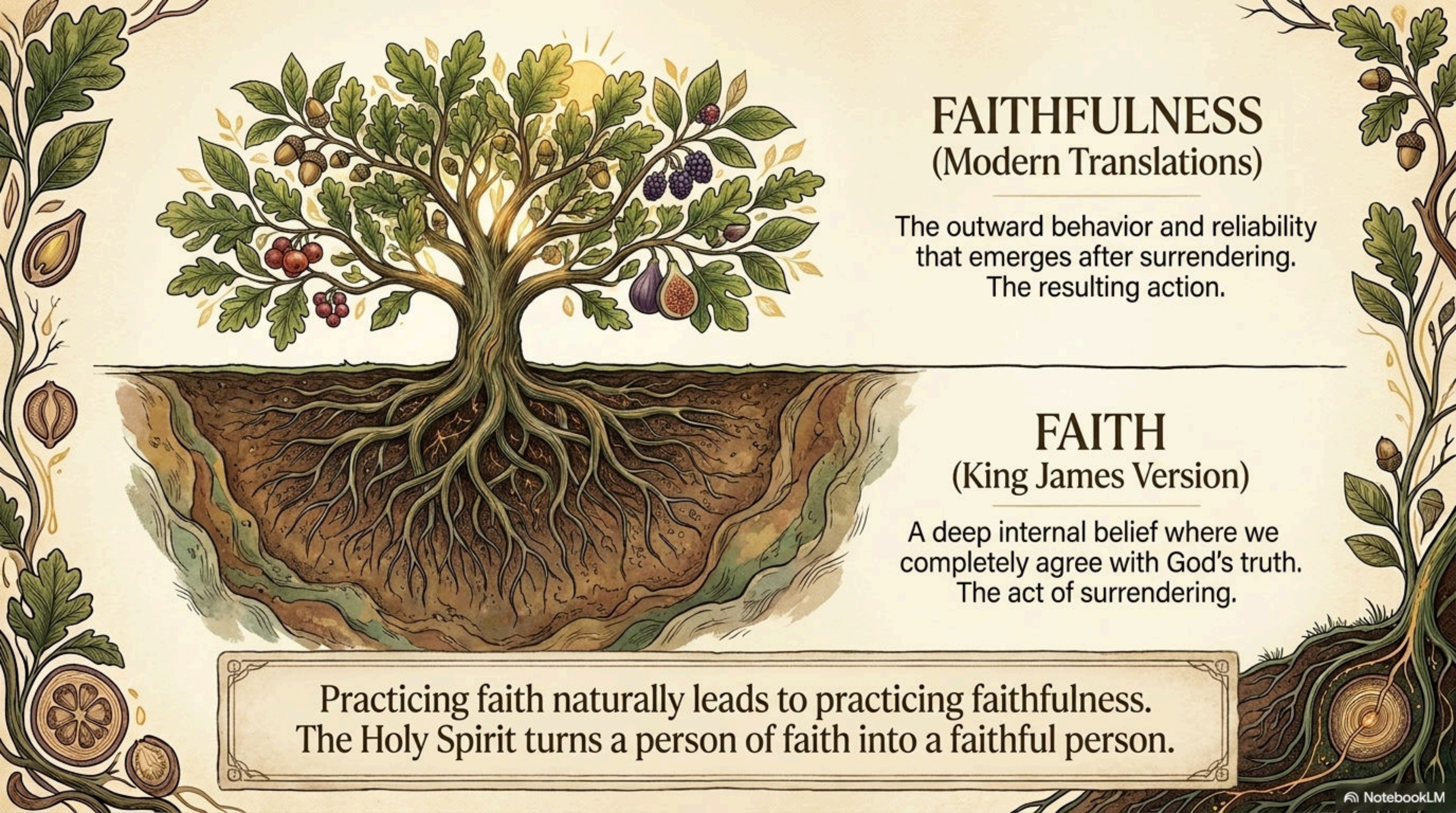
Faithfulness is not manufactured by sheer willpower. Like a strict diet based only on resolve, relying solely on human strength eventually fails.

(Modern Translations)

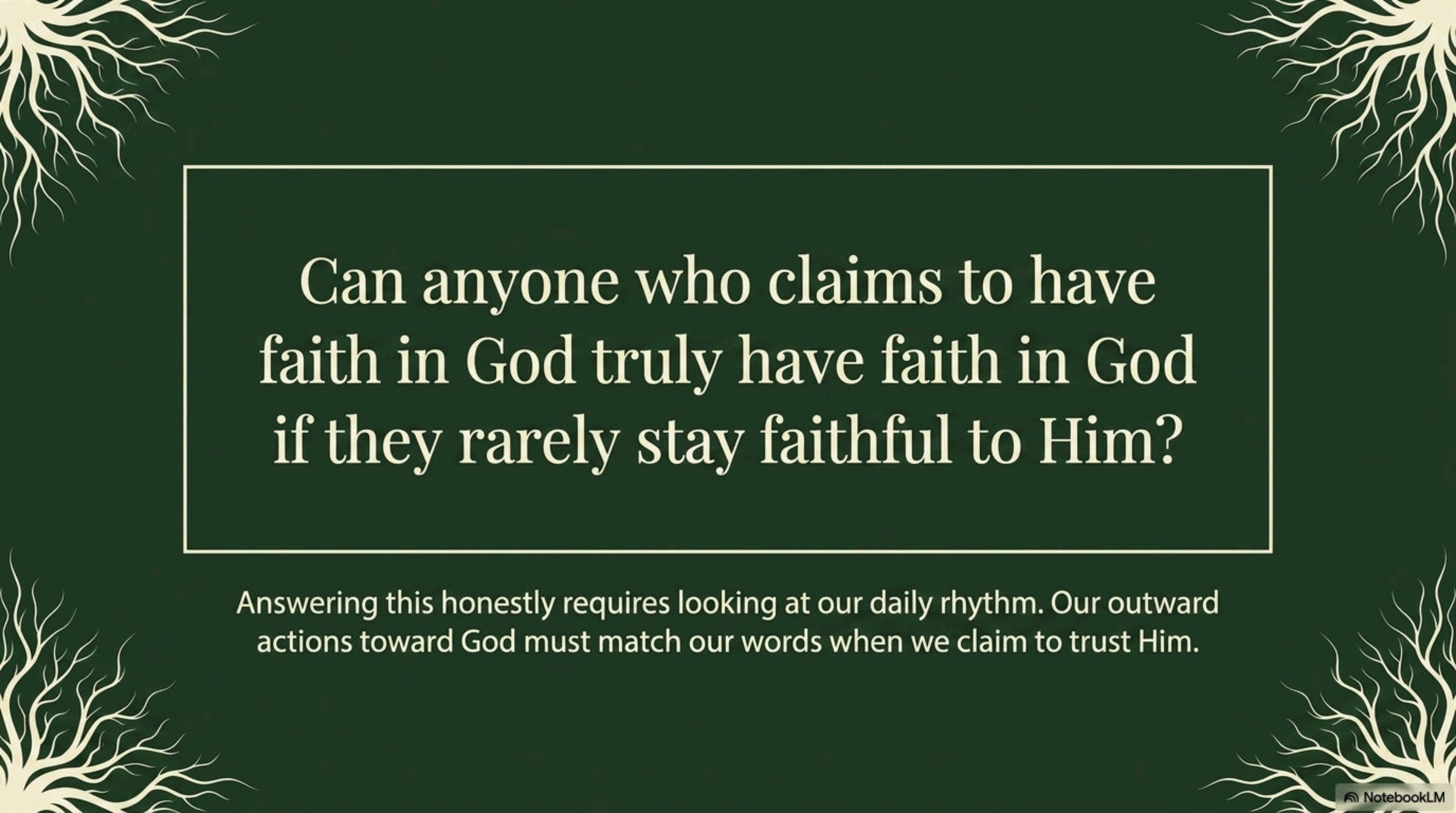
The outward behavior and reliability

The public—doing it so everyone sees.

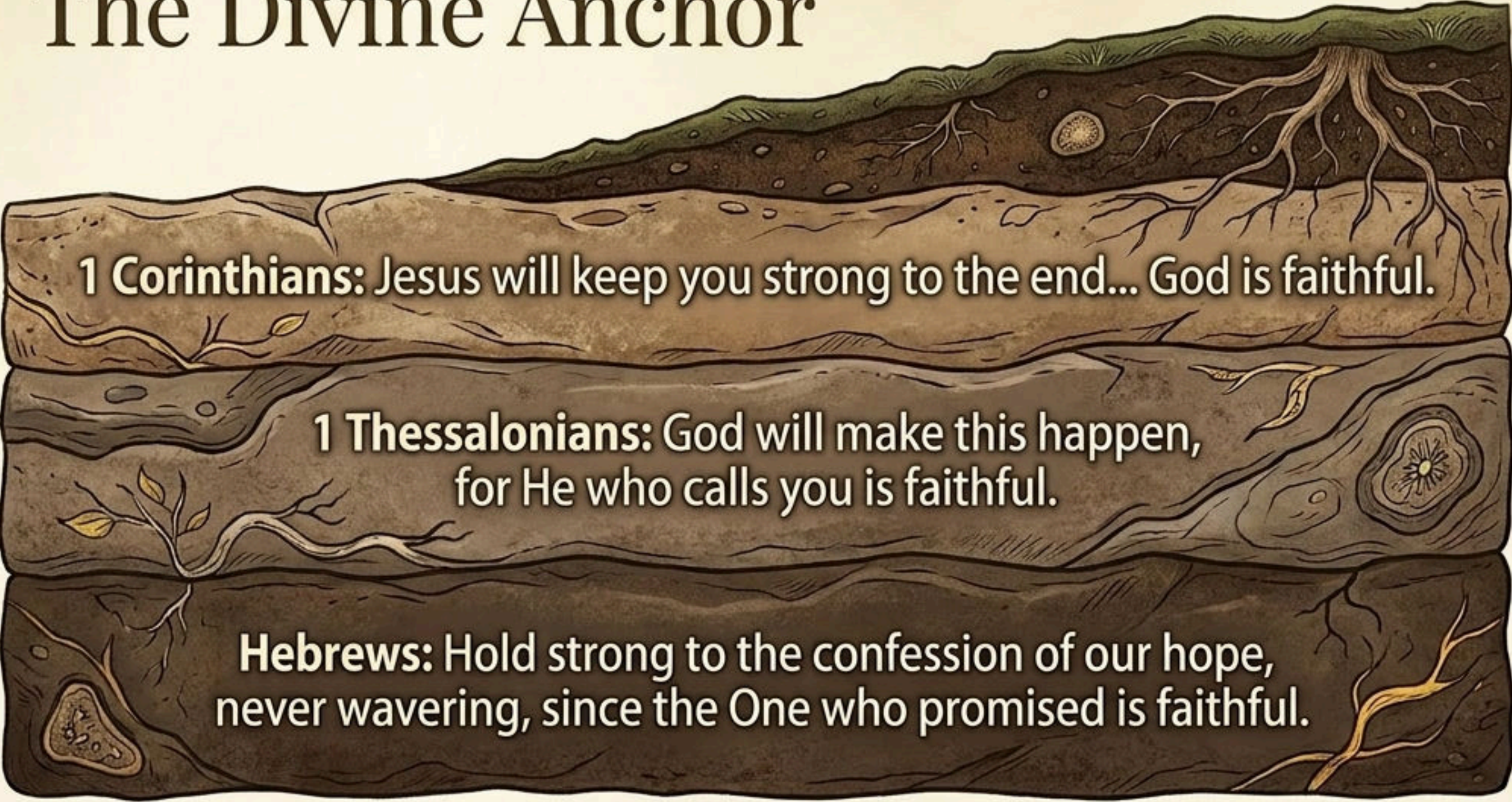
God—acting with integrity when no one is watching.

The Divine Anchor



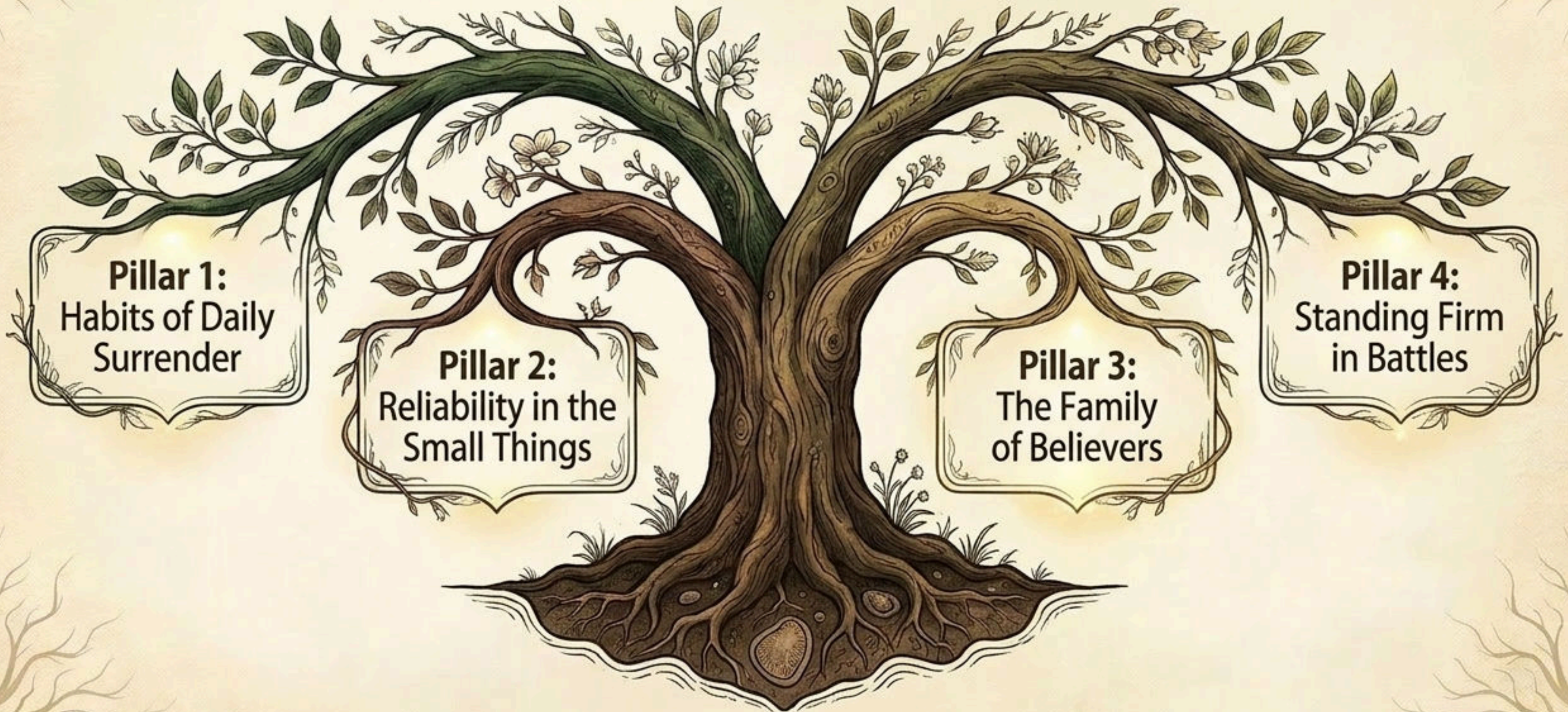
1 Corinthians: Jesus will keep you strong to the end... God is faithful.

for He who calls you is faithful.

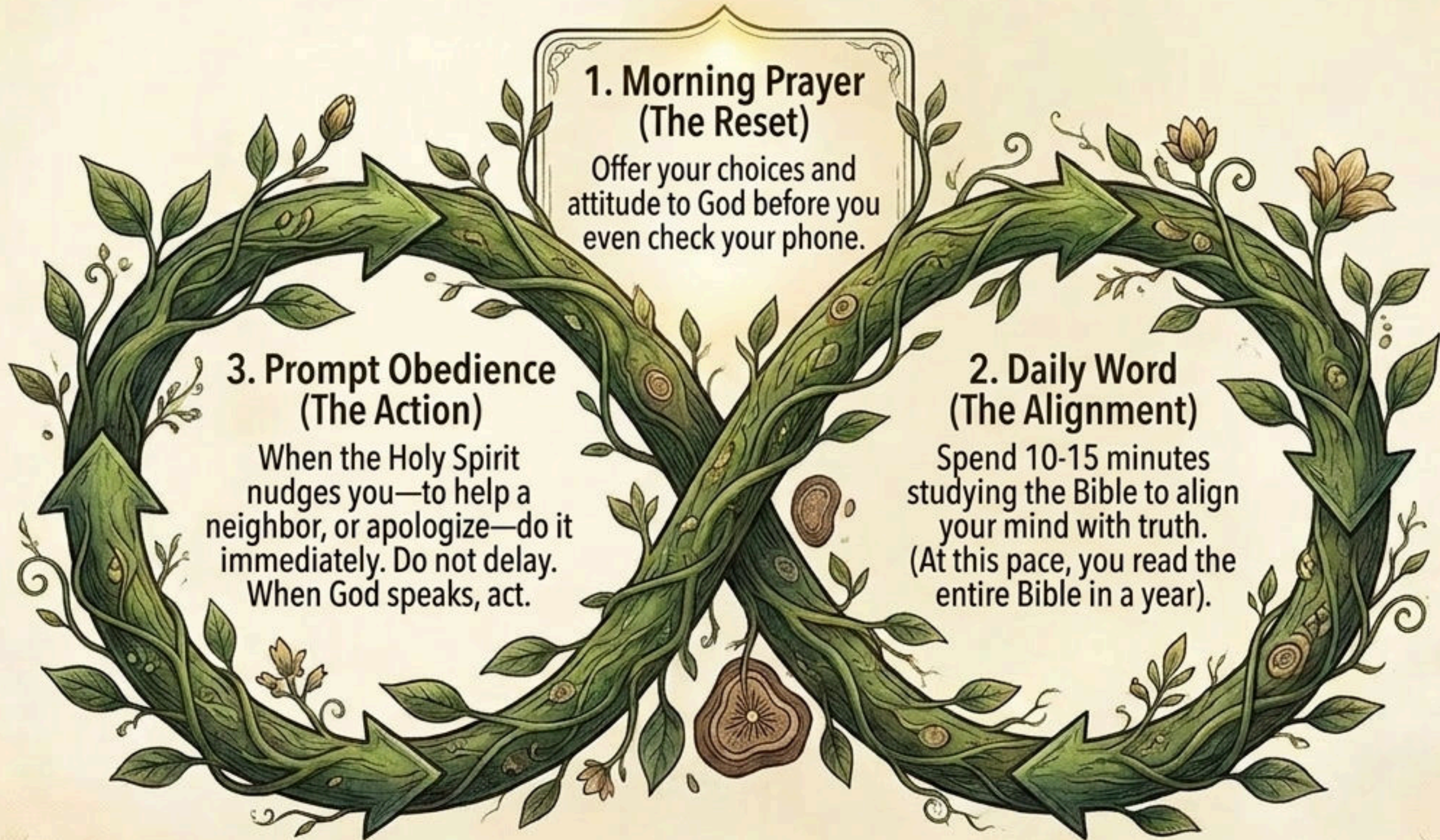
Hebrews: Hold strong to the confession of our hope,

Pillar 1: The Surrender Loop



Pillar 2: Reliability in the Small Things

“Whoever is faithful in very little will also be faithful in much.”



Promises

Let your **yes** be **yes**. If you commit to a task, a volunteer role, or a meeting time, **follow** through without **excuse**.



Work

Perform your daily **job** with **excellence**, especially when no one is watching. That is the true measure of character.



Resources

Be a **steward** of your **finances**, unique talents, and your **time**. Remember: once time is used, it is forever gone.

Pillar 3: The Power of the Church Community

Remaining loyal to God during hard times requires the support you receive from—and give to—other believers.

Be Present

Commit to the local body to worship, learn, and grow alongside others.

Be Accountable

Share spiritual goals and struggles with mature Christian friends who are willing to ask the tough questions.

Serve

Join a ministry to actively practice love and reliability within the community.

The enemy prowls like a roaring lion. Revelation 13 reminds us that true faithfulness is loyalty to God that will never waver, even to the point of death.

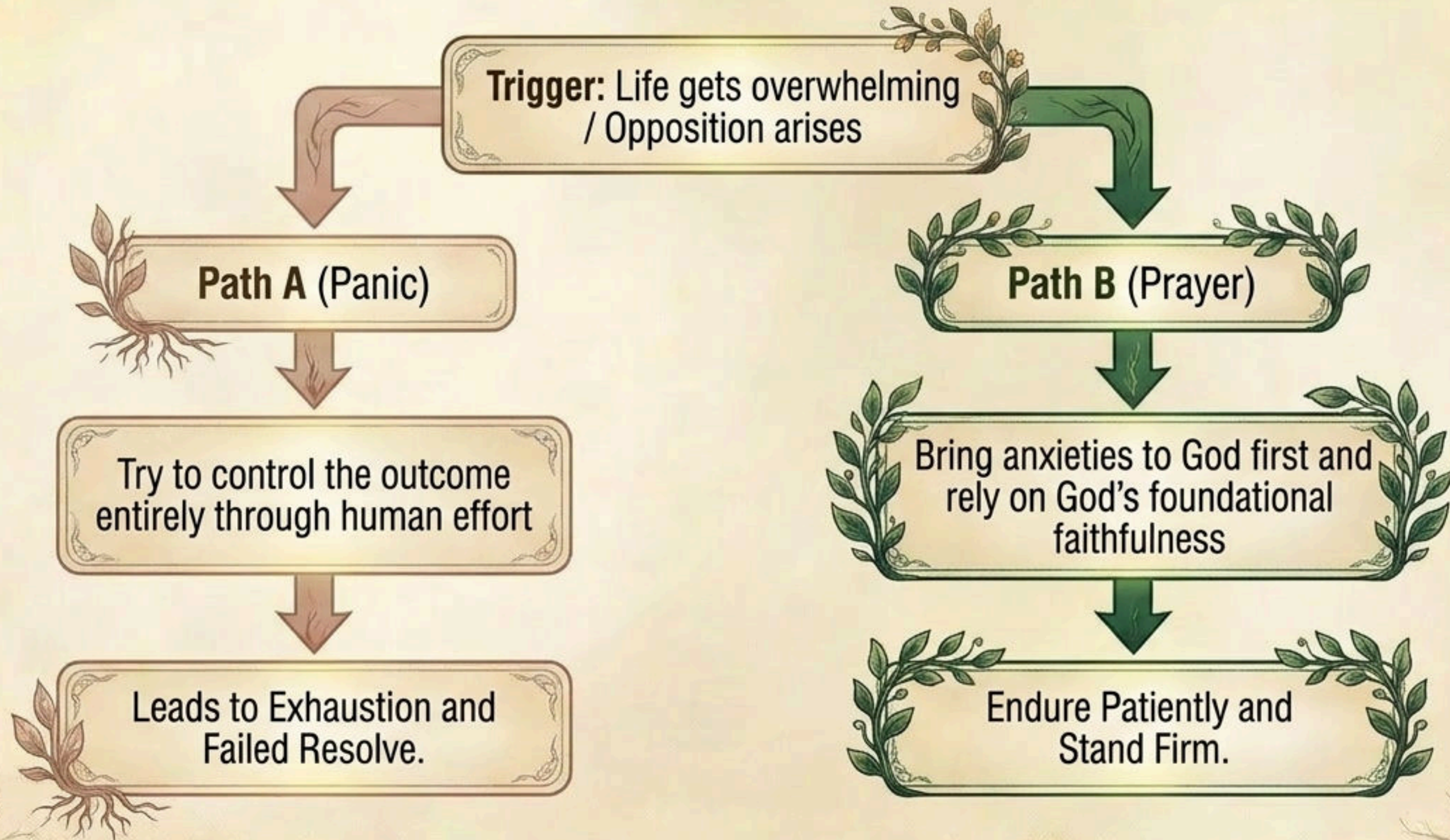
The Defense

Guard your heart by memorizing scripture. Hide His word in your heart so you can stand firm when your faith is tested.

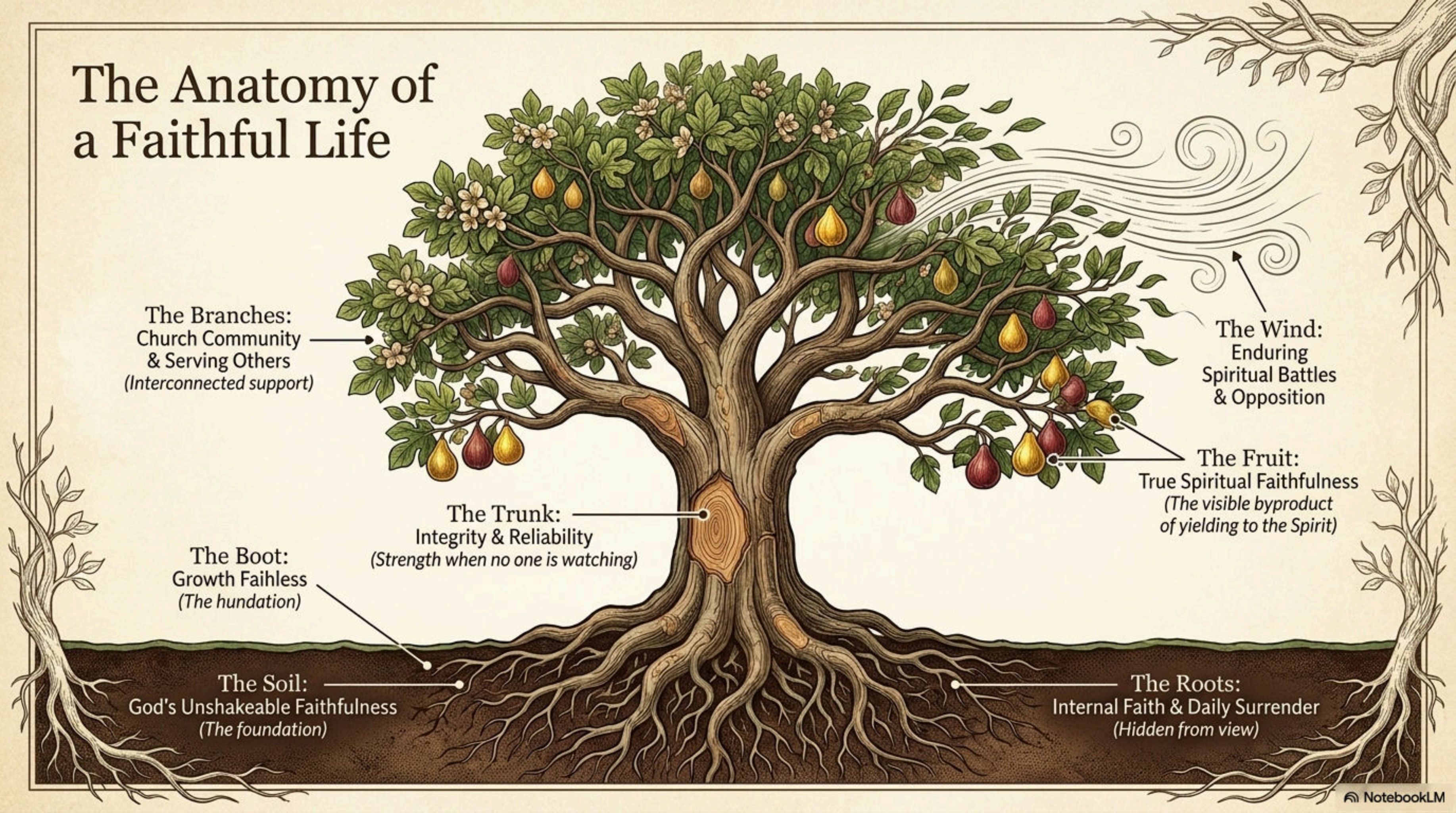
The Perspective

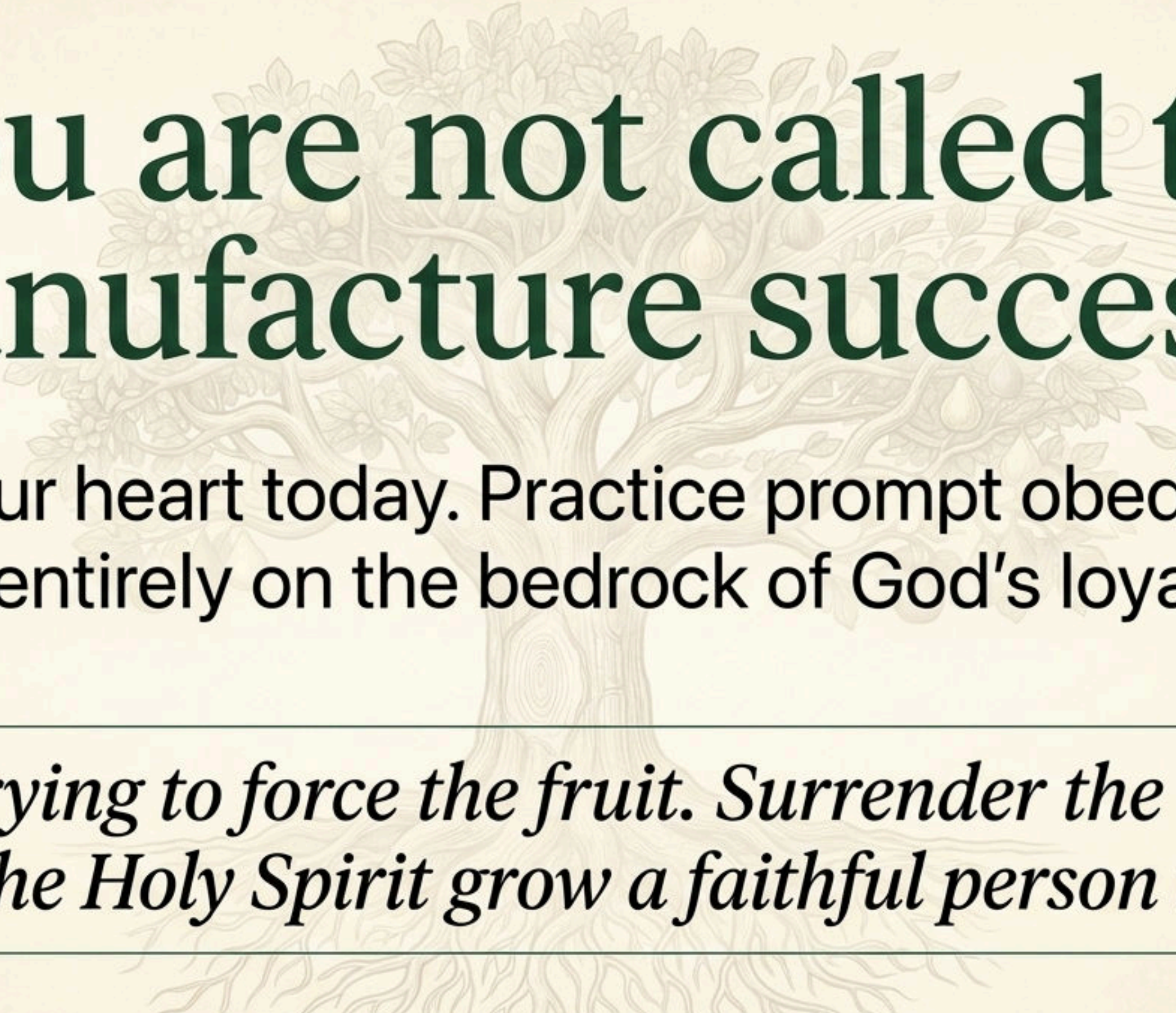
Expect battles. View hard times as opportunities for your endurance and loyalty to be made stronger.
