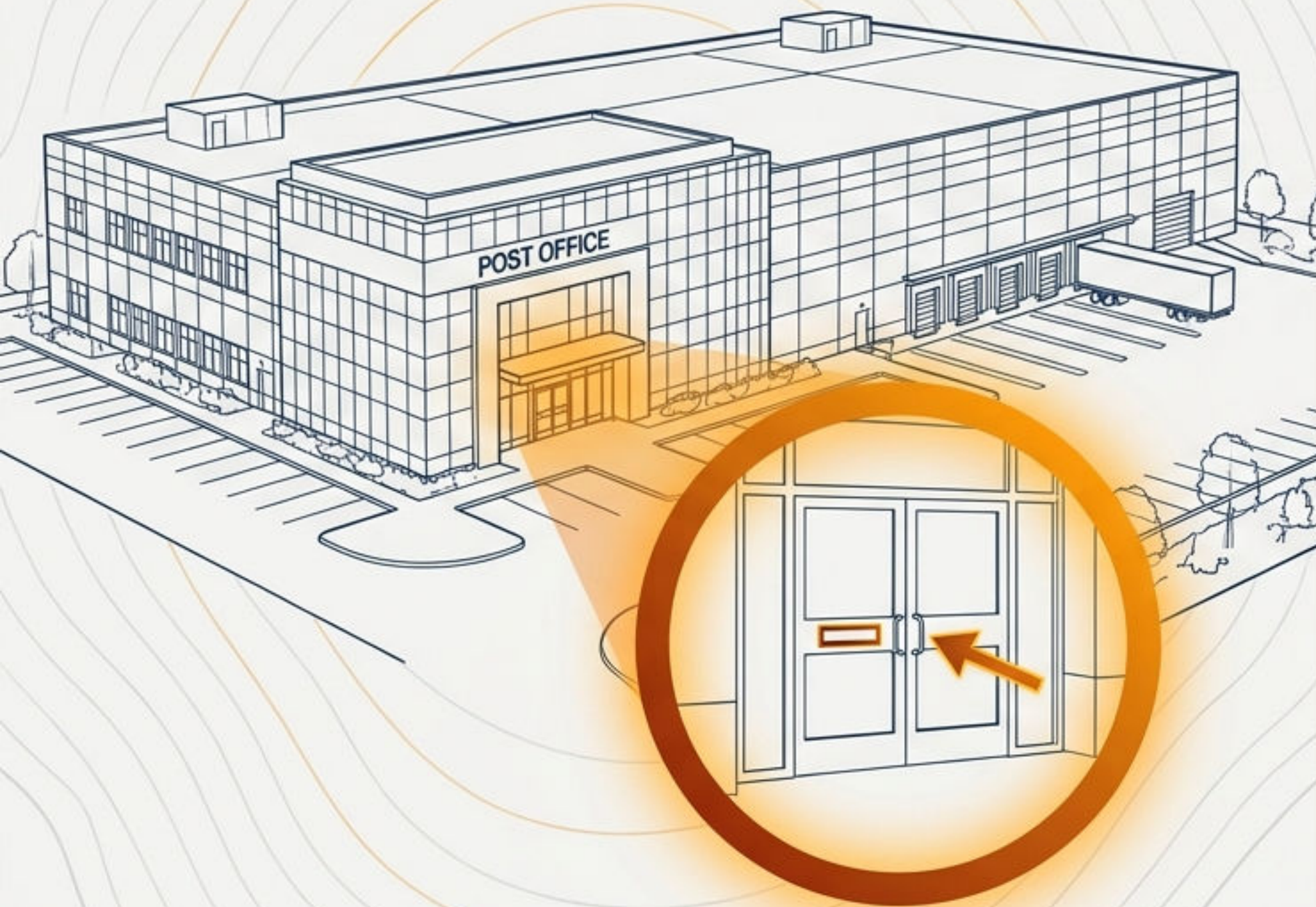


The Missing Slot: Finishing the Task of the Great Commission

Structural Diagnosis: ~50% of American churches mistakenly view the Great Commission as a mandate that only applies to their local neighborhood, completely ignoring the outward flow.

The 3 Pillars of the Great Commission



Pillar 1: **Willing People** (The Call)

God requires absolute availability over capability. True vision requires brokenness.



Pillar 2: **Commanded Purpose** (The Scope)

The mandate is not simply geographic; it is fundamentally cultural and ethnic.

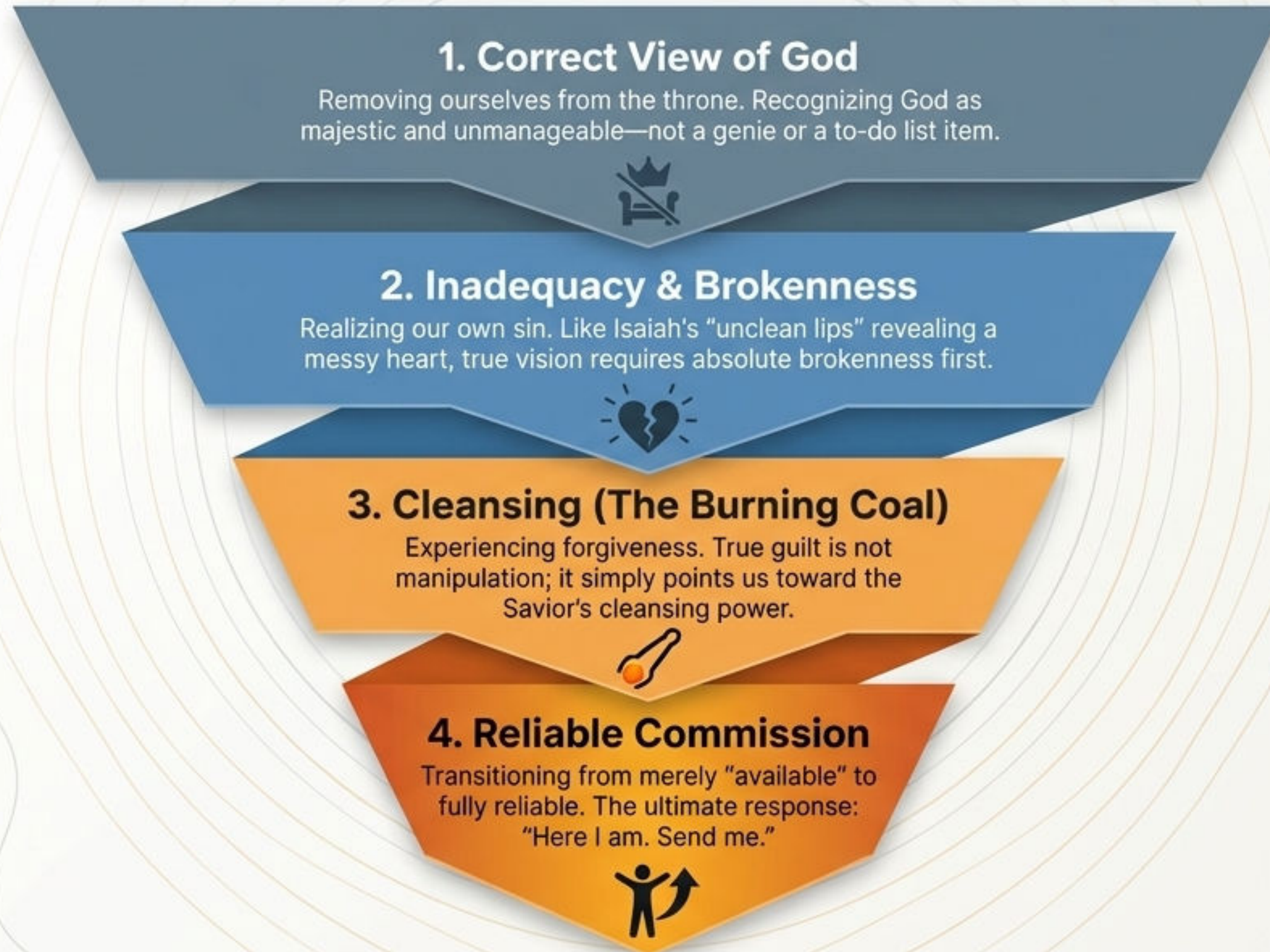


Pillar 3: **Holy Spirit** (The Power)

Human effort without divine energy is exhausting and entirely ineffective.

The Excuse Mindset (The Mt. St. Helens Volunteer)

Stated Posture

"I have plans. I'm busy. Find someone else."

View of God

A manageable entity that should accommodate our personal schedules.

Result

Zero impact. Missed potential.



The "Damaged Goods" Mindset (Davey Gibbs' Mother)

Stated Posture

"I'm extremely damaged goods, but God loves to use extremely damaged goods."

View of God

A God who can multiply absolutely anything placed in His hands.

Result

Grew from 1 bus to 35 buses.
Reached 5,000 children in 5 years.

Pillar 2: Decoding the Commanded Purpose

Poreuthentes

[po-reu-then-tes]

Translation:

“As you are going” or “Since you are going.”

Strategic Implication:

Mission is not a special project or an annual event. It is integrated seamlessly into your daily routines, workplaces, and neighborhoods.

Ethne

[eth-nay]

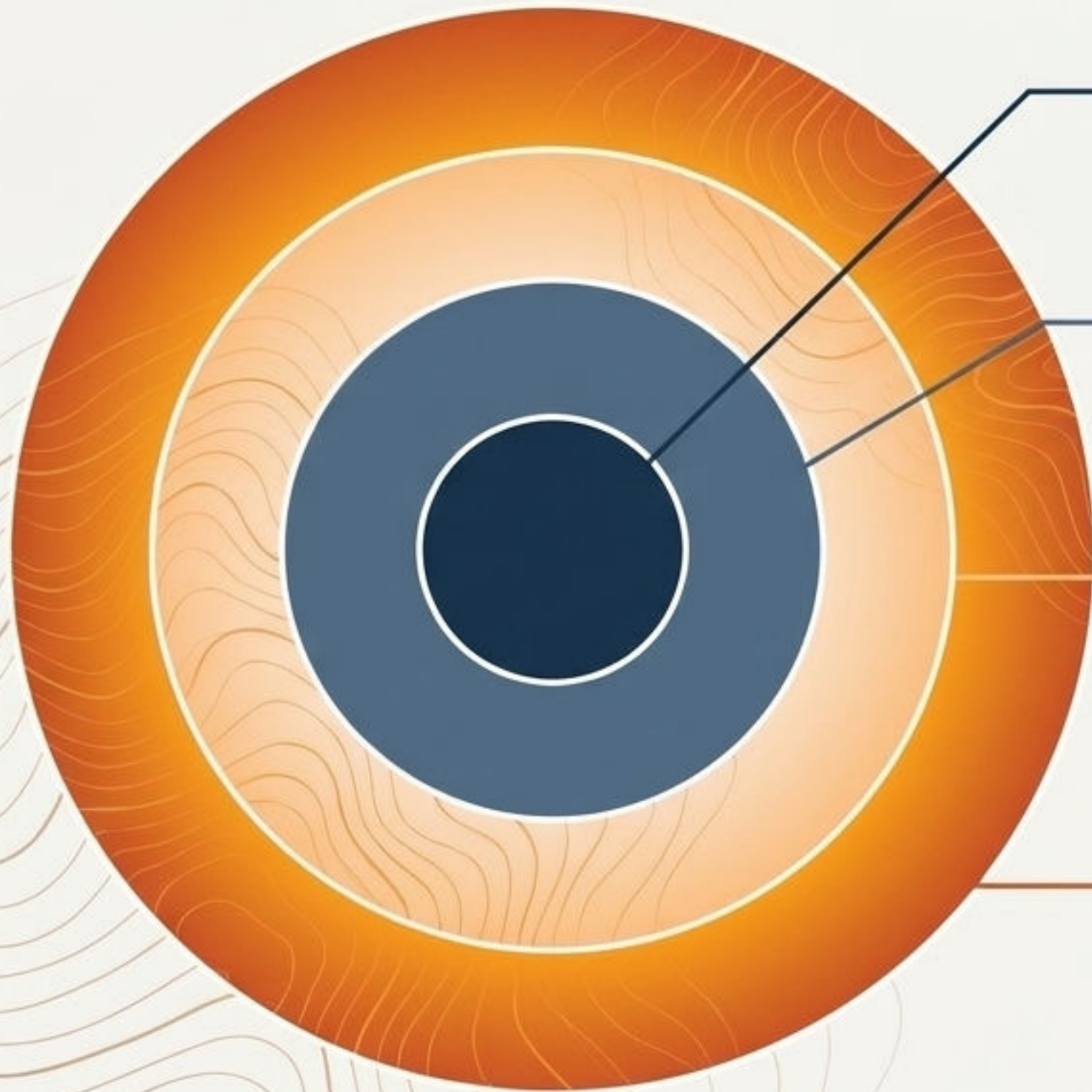
Translation:

Distinct tribes, races, and ethnic groups.

Strategic Implication:

The mandate is not just about drawing geographic borders; it is about crossing cultural boundaries. There are 22,000 distinct Ethne globally.

The Expansion Architecture: Rippling Outward



Jerusalem (The Core): Homes, local neighborhoods, markets, and workplaces.

Judea (Shared Culture): Reaching people with similar backgrounds, language, and culture.

Samaria (The Boundaries): Crossing into outcast communities, differing beliefs, and those typically avoided.

Ends of the Earth (The Horizon): The unreachable places of darkness. We live in an era of unprecedented reach, where singular broadcasts have possessed the capacity to reach 1 billion people at once.

Pillar 3: The Power (Dunamis)



Without Power (Exhaustion)

- Like cutting a 2-acre lawn with hand scissors.
- Like a massive Standard Oil float stalled in a parade because it ran out of gas.
- Effort-driven work is exhausting, frustrating, and yields minimal results.



With Power (**Dunamis**)

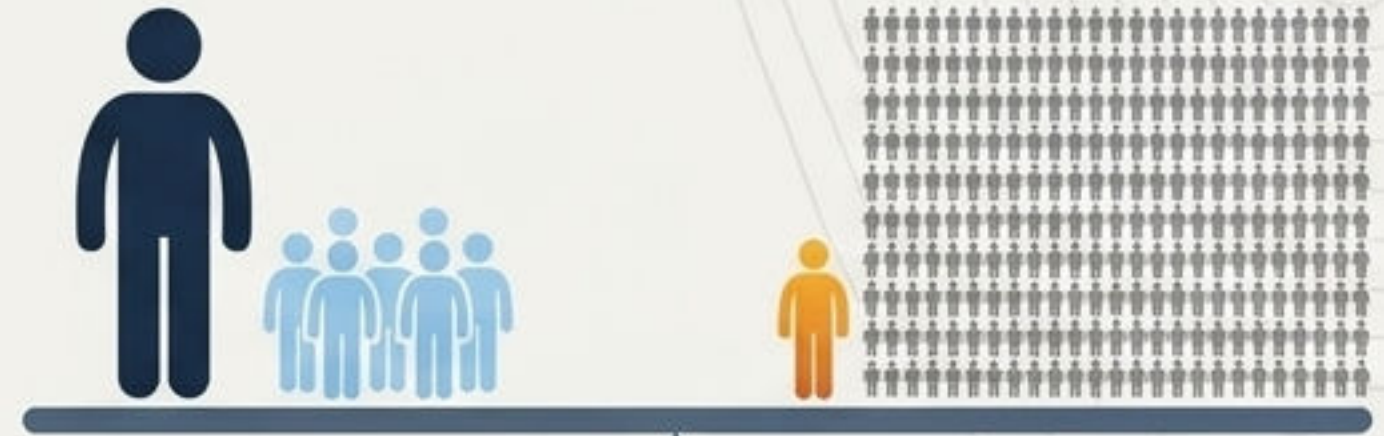
- Dunamis (the Greek root of dynamite) provides explosive capability.
- The ability comes before the task. We do not have to force people to change their hearts.
- The Spirit does the heavy lifting of conviction. We merely provide the witness.

The Global Reality: A Strategic Imbalance

98% of giving stays local
(85% never leaves the building).

2%

Only **2%** goes
toward global
missions.



US: 1 worker
per 500 people.

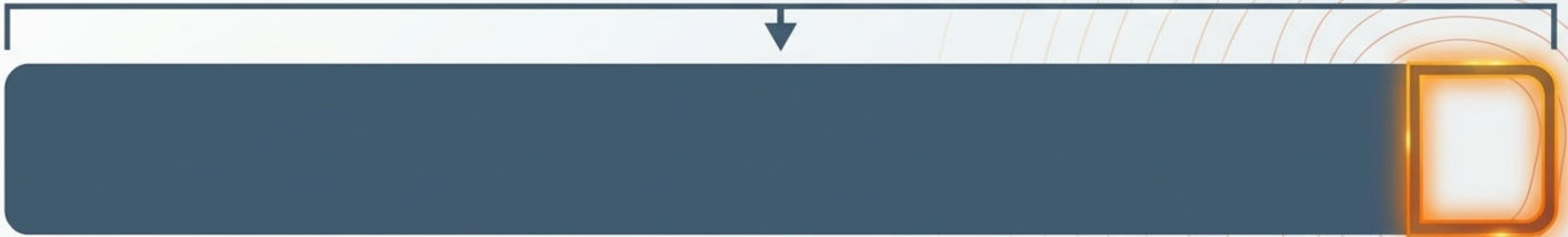
Global Unreached:
1 worker per 50,000 people.

The Strategic Pivot

Historically, only **1%** of mission resources reached the world's 1 billion Muslims. The Christian and Missionary Alliance (CMA) is now actively directing **over 50% of its budget** to **Muslim-majority areas** to close this gap.

The Unfinished Task

Total Scope: 22,000 distinct people groups globally



The Remaining Gap: Only 1,700 languages/groups remain waiting for a single verse of scripture to be translated.

The bulk of the work is complete. We are in the final fraction of the Great Commission. Do we want to be involved when the task is finally finished?

Local Reality: Danville Alliance Update (September 2026)



5 out of 5 local and international outreach goals already met for the year.



Giving is currently running ahead of the operational budget.



Spending is being maintained strictly inside/under budget.



\$2,500 GAP

We are exactly \$2,500 short of our yearly Great Commission Fund goal. With three full months left in 2026, we have a unique window to close this gap and go far above and beyond our commitment.

The Synthesis Arc: A 'Sent' Strategy

	Mindset:	Shift from "Someone else will do it" to "Send me." Offer whatever you have right now to God, no matter how small or damaged.
	Method:	Stop trimming the lawn by hand. Wait and pray before you work. Rely entirely on God's explosive spirit (Dunamis) rather than your own exhausting willpower.
	Means:	Put your money where your mission is. Because 98% of church funds stay local, make a personal decision to reverse that trend and aggressively fund global deployment.

Immediate Next Steps: Closing the Loop



1. PRAY

Intercede for our onsite missionaries and the 1,700 people groups still waiting for a single translated verse of scripture.



2. GO

Share the good news “as you are going.” View your daily routines, workplaces, and local neighborhoods as your Jerusalem.



3. GIVE

Help close the \$2,500 gap for the Great Commission Fund today, and redirect your surplus giving to blow past the goal for the remainder of 2026.
